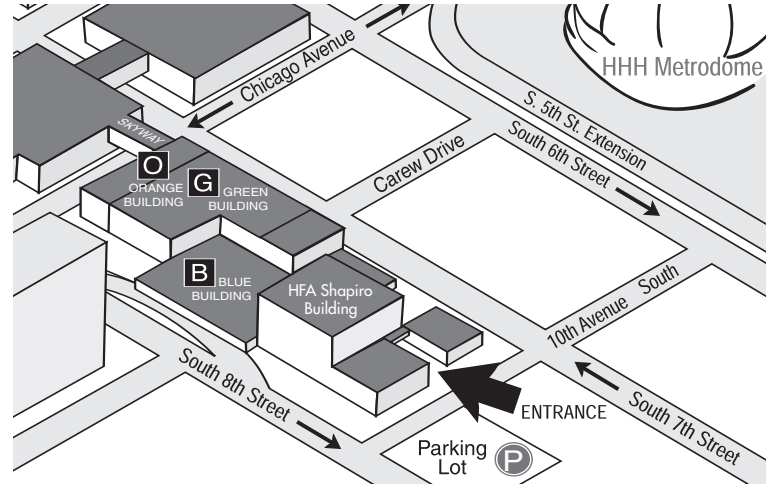

The Hennepin Center for Diabetes and Endocrinology helps those with hormonal disorders such as diabetes and thyroid problems, as well as those with disorders of other hormone-producing glands.

Diabetes is the most prevalent hormonal disorder. Approximately 8 percent of Americans have Type 2 Diabetes. Another 57 million adults have “pre-diabetes.”

Diabetes

Diabetes is a disorder of higher-than-normal blood glucose levels. It occurs when the pancreas either does not produce enough insulin, or the body does not respond correctly to insulin. Insulin is produced to help your body store and use the nutrients from the food you eat.

Pre-diabetes

Pre-diabetes is a condition in which blood glucose is elevated, but not yet high enough to be diagnosed as Type 2 Diabetes. Long-term damage may begin in the body with pre-diabetes. However, research shows that Type 2 Diabetes can be delayed or prevented by improving nutrition, controlling or losing weight, and exercising more.
